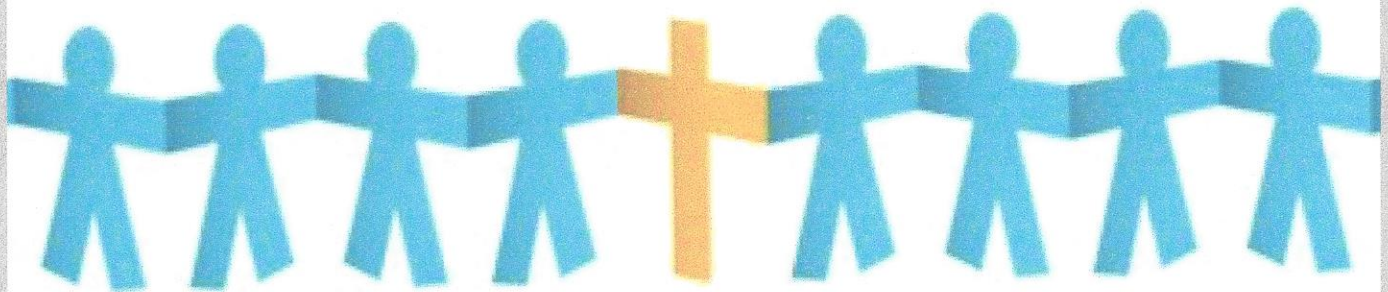

WE WOULD LIKE TO INVITE YOU

To participate in a group known as Faith, Fun and Friends, evenings designed especially for adult with cognitive and/or emotional disabilities. At this time we have three such programs, one at Fellowship Lutheran Church in Sterling Heights, one at St. Therese of Lisieux Parish in Shelby Township and one at St. John and Paul in Washington Township. The first two are evenings programs running from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. .. Fellowship meets every other Monday evening while St. Therese meets every other Friday evening St. John and Paul meets once a month on the first Saturday of each month from 1 to 2:30 p.m. There is no charge for any of these groups and they are open to persons of all denominations as well as to those who have no church affiliation. Here is how a typical evening runs.

At 6:30 p.m. we begin to gather, to have light refreshment and catch up on all the great things going on in our lives, good and not so good. Then one of the leaders will open the evening with a scripture reading and discussion, generally something from the readings of the past couple of weeks, whatever seems to speak to those things happening in the lives of the participants. Discussion will then center around what was just heard and how these words apply to our lives at home or the workplace. This takes about a half hour and then we get ready to play games or do crafts. Uno and Bunco are favorites as well as board games. On holidays we may play Bingo with prizes yet (usually from the \$1 store). There is generally a lot of talking and laughing and kibitzing as we play. At St. Therese we have a member who is very musically talented and he brings his keyboard each week and we can listen or sing as he plays.

About 8:15 we clean up and then gather in a large circle, join hands and pray for anything or anyone who needs our prayer at that time. We end with the Our Father, a prayer known to every Christian denomination. Altogether, the format is very simple but one that seems to work well

St. John and Paul is a bit different, more a teaching and craft group and they have many younger people in that group. You might want to check them out to see if they are what you are seeking.

Occasionally we have 'field trips' sometimes to concerts offered by other groups in the area. We have gone bowling during the summer or to watch the Tigers play or gathered at the home of a leader or member to enjoy a picnic or barbecue. We have had memorial services for family members, gone to Stations of the Cross during Lent or to a Fish Fry. Several of our members have attended retreats offered in the area. Some of these activities have to be paid for by those choosing to take part in a retreat or a Tiger game. Each year and each group is a little different but over the years we have become strong friends and shared laughter, tears and lots of love.

We even like to get involved in doing service for our community in helping out where ever we can.

Come check us out. We think you might enjoy the experience and you may find old friends there or make new ones. We look forward to meeting you.
